Le chafaud discovery centre

Located in the Chafaud building, the Discovery Centre is the starting point for planning your visit to the park's natural areas. Meet with a Naturalist Park Rangers and view the two exhibits: one on the park's history, fauna, flora and geology, the other on the story of the French in Percé's fishing industry during the 16th and 17th centuries.

Le Relais des Fous

Located right beside the Northern Gannet colony, a beautiful patio offering a quick bite to eat. Enjoy a meal and a local beer (Pit Caribou) while taking in the unique surroundings.



Pirate Duval's treasure hunt

Take part in a treasure hunting activity on Île Bonaventure! Go at your own pace and who knows? You might even find Pirate Duval's treasure hidden! The first section is located on the Les Colonies Trail and the second is on the Chemin du Roy Trail.

Resto des Margaulx

Housed in the former warehouse of the LeBoutillier company on Île Bonaventure, the park's restaurant is a great place to recharge your batteries or pick up a picnic lunch. On the menu: soups, salads, a wide selection of sandwiches, desserts, hot and cold beverages, and local beers.



The Northern Gannet colony

The sight of 200,000 birds nesting on Bonaventure Island, including the 110,000 individuals that make up the most accessible Northern Gannet colony in the world, will be the highlight of your visit. On site, a park naturalist will be available to answer your questions.

The LeBoutillier house

The LeBoutillier Brothers Management House holds all operational secrets of a historical Jersey fishing company. Come visit and immerse yourself in this storied location.

Marine protected zones

The marine area consists of two zones featuring a wide variety of landscapes and organisms and is part of the park's conservation mandate: a first 100-metre marine strip around Bonaventure Island, and a second 100-metre strip around Percé Rock, including the intertidal zone of Pointe du Mont-Joli. A joint research project with the Aquarium du Québec is currently underway in the Bonaventure Island marine band. The purpose of this project is to assess the impact of scubadiving activities on the organisms living in this habitat to implement mitigating measures where necessary.

Over 200,000 seabirds

Parc national de l'Île-Bonaventure-etdu-Rocher-Percé is home to the largest migratory bird sanctuary in North America. Home to over 200,000 nesting birds of eleven different species, these colonies are sensitive to boat disturbance in the marine area of the park. Awarenessraising campaigns and boat patrols are carried out to ensure the protection of these bird colonies.

Our national parks

Given the millions of visits to our national parks annually, harmful behaviors can cause permanent damage to the environment and negatively impact the experience of other visitors. Let's do our part to care for these extraordinary nature sites so we can all enjoy them for years to come.

Stay on trails and in designated visitor areas Taking shortcuts can destroy vegetation.

Do not gather dead wood*

To preserve the natural environment, it is prohibited to remove natural elements, including animals, plants, dead wood, and rocks.



Do not feed wildlife*

Feeding wildlife negatively impacts their natural feeding habits. Keep all food out of reach of animals.



Keep your distance when observing wildlife


When animals are repeatedly disturbed, their natural behaviors can change, and they can develop problems to feed, find a mate, and communicate among themselves.



Respect the peace and tranquility, and comply with curfews
